



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MEDICAL EXAMINER PRELIMINARY SUMMARY OF CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING DEATH*

On 30 Dec. 2018, I received a death notification from Captain Gaither Clayton -Caswell County EMS. Cpt. Clayton advised that a Lion attack had occurred at the Conservators Center. I responded to the scene and was greeted by detectives with the Caswell Co. Sheriff's Department. Lt. Eugene Riddick - Caswell Co. Sheriff's Department advised that earlier in the day that , and the decedent who was also an intern were in the lion enclosure at the Conservators Center for the purpose of cleaning the enclosure. Lt. Riddick advised that reported that she separated the lion (name: Matthai) into a lock-out section of the enclosure, however reported that a large play ball obstructed the gate that secures the lock-out section and that the lion was able to enter the lock-out section of the enclosure and the decedent were in. Lt. Riddick advised that that reported that the lion attacked the decedent in the lock-out section of the enclosure. Lt. Riddick advised that reported that she tried to separate the lion from the decedent, but that the lion's foot struck the decedent's foot when the lion was leaving the lock-out section entering the enclosure, however before could close the gate to the lock-out section the lion was able to bite the decedent's ankle and pull her into the enclosure where the lion continued to attack the decedent. Lt. Riddick advised fire department personnel attempted to use a firehose to spray water in an attempt to separate the lion from the decedent, but those attempts were unsuccessful. Lt. Riddick advised that the lion dragged the decedent around the enclosure by her neck for an extended amount

Upon my arrival, I entered the lion enclosure and noted the decedent's body was located on the left side of the enclosure and the lion's body was located approx. 30 ft away from the decedent on the right side of the enclosure. Initial assessment of the decedent revealed she died from multi-traumatic deep lacerations to the neck with significant blood loss.

of time. Lt. Riddick advised that multiple attempts to dart the lion to sedate him failed and his deputies had to shoot the lion 8 times with shotguns to euthanize

the lion to ensure that the decedent's body could be safely recovered.

I called OCME and reported the incident and was informed to secure the decedent's body and have it held in the morgue at Alamance Regional Medical Center (ARMC) until pathologist could meet the following morning to determine a case disposition. I authorized Caswell Co. EMS to transport the decedent to the morgue at ARMC.

****REPORT CONTINUED****

While on-scene, I examined the lion and his upper cuspid canine teeth measured 2.5 inches while his bottom cuspid canine teeth measured 1.5 inches. The lion's front claws when expressed measured 1.5 inches. The lion died from multiple shotgun wound to his upper torso.

After leaving the scene, I reported to the morgue at ARMC and completed my ME exam of the decedent. The traumatic injuries are list as follows:

- Decedent sustained puncture wounds to the right forearm indicative of defensive wounds/bites
- The decedent had numerous lacerations to her shoulders, torso, abdomen, and upper right thigh that matched claw wounds.
- There were no injuries to the lower extremities.
- The decedent sustained numerous deep puncture wounds to the occipital bone of the skull indicative of bite wounds.
- The decedent sustained a deep laceration to her right shoulder that was indicative of a bite wound.
- The decedent sustained a deep laceration to the anterior of her neck that upon examination lacerated the trachea and esophagus.
- The decedent sustained a deep laceration to the right lateral side of her neck that upon examination lacerated the external jugular vein and carotid artery.
- The decedent sustained a deep laceration to the posterior of her neck that fractured the spinal cord and upon palpation crepitus of the spinal cord was noted.

I later received a notification from OCME and was informed this case will be an ME External case. A complete ME exam of the decedent was completed, I obtained photos, and obtains blood and vitreous from the eyes and mailed same to OCME in Raleigh, NC. I signed the death certificate, and released the body for funeral services. Nothing follows.......
